JUNIOR CHOIR rehearses on Sundays in the parish church, gathering in the choir stalls at 12.30pm after the service.

YOUNG CHURCH gathers after the Collect at the foot of the choir steps before proceeding to the Crypt for their teaching; they re-join the congregation for Communion. Parents with babies and younger children may use the Browning Room, where a speaker relays the service. Children must be accompanied to or from the Browning Room and must never be left unattended.

Collect of the Week:

MUSIC NOTES

Kenneth Leighton (1929 - 1988) held academic posts at the Universities of Leeds, Oxford and Edinburgh. Perhaps best known for his choral music, he was also a prolific composer of chamber music, concertos, symphonies, and an opera. Now a staple of the Anglican choral repertoire, the *Missa brevis*, Op 50, was written in 1968 for the choir of Liverpool Cathedral. Leighton sets the Communion service from the Book of Common Prayer for unaccompanied choir. The *Gloria* and *Sanctus* display dancing rhythms, largely homophonic textures with bare harmonies, with lightly imitative textures for the more discursive moments in the text. The *Agnus Dei* is more intimate, but retains an intensity through its expressive harmonies.

Schütz's motet *Ich bin ein rechter Weinstock* is simple and tender in its expression of the text. Published in his collection *Geistliche Chormusik* of 1648, the delicate opening vocal lines symbolizing the fragility of the winding vines, and the homophony of the ending the comfort of abiding in Christ.

Text and Translation:

Ich bin ein rechter Weinstock, mein Vater ein Weingärtner.

*Eine jegliche Rebe an mir, die nicht Frucht bringet, wird er wegnehmen,
und eine jegliche, die da Frucht bringet, wird er reinigen,
dass sie mehr Frucht bringe.*

Ich bin der Weinstock, ihr seid die Reben.

Bleibet in mir und ich in euch.

Gleichwie die Rebe kann keine Frucht bringen von ihr selber,

sie bleibe denn am Weinstock,

also auch ihr nicht, ihr bleibet denn in mir.

I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine keeper.

*Every branch in me that bears no fruit, he cuts away,
and every branch that does bear fruit, he cleans to make it bear even more.*

I am the vine, you are the branches.

Abide in me, as I in you.

As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself,

unless it remains part of the vine,

neither can you unless you remain in me.
