**YOUNG CHURCH** gathers after the Collect at the foot of the choir steps before proceeding to the Crypt for their teaching; they re-join the congregation for Communion. Parents with babies and younger children may use the Browning Room, where a speaker relays the service. Children must be accompanied to or from the Browning Room and must never be left unattended.

**Collect of the Week:**

Almighty God, who calledst Luke the physician, whose praise is in the gospel, to be an evangelist and physician of the soul: may it please thee that, by the wholesome medicines of the doctrine delivered by him, all the diseases of our souls may be healed; through the merits of thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

Eternal God, comfort of the afflicted and healer of the broken, thou hast restored us to life, through the death and resurrection of thine only Son, Jesus Christ; continue in us and through us, thy great work of healing and reconciliation that we might go forth from this table to live and work in the power of thy holy and life-giving Spirit. **Amen**

**MUSIC NOTES**

**Mozart** wrote his *Missa brevis in D* K194 in 1774 at the age of eighteen. As with many of his shorter mass settings, it is a remarkably compact and tightly constructed work, ingenious in its concision. Nevertheless, the solo lines display flashes of Mozart's melodic fluency, as well as a sense of musical drama and humour – heard at its most developed in the Agnus Dei.

**Francisco Guerrero** (1528-99) was one of the most widely published Spanish composers of his generation, second in reputation only to Victoria. He worked at Seville Cathedral from 1551 until his death, and through his regular travelling, his music was much performed in the Spanish-American colonies. *Hoc est praeceptum meum* is a beautifully constructed contrapuntal five-part motet.

Translation:

*Hoc est praeceptum meum ut diligatis invicem sicut dilexi vos.*

*Maiorem charitatem nemo habet ut animam suam ponat quis pro amicis suis.*

*Vos amici mei estis si feceritis quae praecipio vobis.*

*Vos autem dixi amicos quia omnia quaecumque audivi a Patre meo nota feci vobis.*

*This is my commandment, that you love one another, as I have loved you.*

*Greater love than this no man hath, that a man lay down his life for his friends.*

*You are my friends, if you do the things that I command you.*

*But I have called you friends because all things, whatsoever I have heard of my Father, I have made known to you.*

**Orlando de Lassus** was born in Mons (Hainaut) in 1532 and died in Munich in 1594. He was one of the most gifted and prolific composers of his time, and although little is known about his early life, legend has it that he was three times abducted because of the beauty of his voice. It was during his time as *maestro di capella* in Munich that Lassus wrote much of his liturgical music.

Our Giving by Text provider DONATE™ provides a means for you to reclaim any Gift Aid on donations made by registering for Gift Aid when giving through DONATE™, but you only need to do this once for all future transactions on DONATE™ to be Gift Aided automatically.
